- Recognise, find and write fractions of a discrete set of objects: unit fractions and non-unit fractions with small denominators

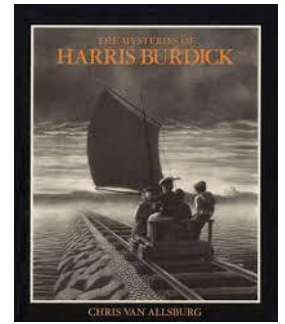


Money:

Physics: Magnet and Forces

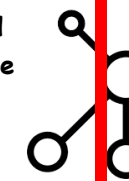
- Compare how things move on different surfaces.

Art and D&T

In art the children will be thinking about the experience of family life and how this impacts on our lives has provided inspiration for artists for centuries. We will be looking at English artist, **Henry Walton's** formal portraits of families, before the use of photography, and Willow Tree sculptures created by artist **Susan Lordi**. Within DT we shall be looking at and building shell structures. Starting with looking at natural shell structures and how they have influenced structural designs.

Geography- Volcanoes and Earthquakes

The children will be looking at the layers of the earth and categorising the Earth's main tectonic plates in terms of how they are moving. As well as developing an understanding for the similarities and differences between the physical processes that create earthquakes and those that create volcanoes.

History

In this terms history lessons the children will be learning about another significant civilization, the Vikings. The Vikings, from Scandinavia, were excellent sailors, explorers and warriors.
