The right course of action for the immediate future is to rest; a key Christian virtue, alongside the ones we share as a community.

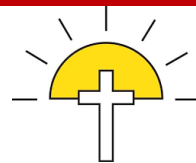
We'll be ready in September to welcome secondary phase pupils back into school. In the meantime, do stay safe and have a great summer.

This was the third Spelling Bee held this academic year, following the successful Year 7 competition in Term 1 and the Year 8 competition in Term 3. Due to the recent heatwave, the final was moved from the school hall to the air-conditioned library, providing a much more comfortable setting for contestants and spectators alike. Great British Summer Savings

Rising prices can make life's little treats harder to afford, especially during the school holidays when costs build up for families. This Government is determined to help, and that is why last month the Chancellor announced the *Great British Summer Savings* scheme.

From 25 June to 1 September 2026, the Government is temporarily cutting VAT from 20% to 5% on children's meals in restaurants, children and family tickets to cinemas, theatres, concerts and exhibitions, and admission to a wide range of attractions. Combined with free bus travel during August for children aged 5 to 15 in England, families and young people will be able to enjoy experiences that make summer special, including visits to the kinds of cultural and educational attractions that enrich children's lives outside the classroom.

The public are ready to get behind the scheme and are keen to take advantage of the discounts available. As trusted pillars of their communities, schools play a vital role in connecting families with important information.

We need you to help spread the word. So please share details of the *Great British Summer Savings* scheme through your newsletters, school apps, and other communications to parents and carers, so that the families in your school community know about the experiences they can enjoy this summer for less.

This forms part of a broader effort by the Government to ease financial pressures on families. From ending the two-child limit and expanding free school meals, to rolling out free breakfast clubs and delivering 30 hours of free childcare, this Government is taking action to put more money back into parents' pockets and give every child the best possible start in life.

Summer Safeguarding Bulletin



Safeguarding is always at the forefront of everything we do here at Saint George's, and we continue to educate your children around contextual safeguarding and raise awareness around social media, active bystander approach, hate crime, drug awareness, knife crime, to name a few, by working closely with Kent Police. We are open to any suggestions/recommendations that you, as parents/carers, may have to be explored further by external organisations/assemblies/workshops. As we come to the end of this academic year, we reflect on some of the high's that students at Saint George's have encountered from September 2025 – July 2026: –

- Some brilliant school trips which included Disneyland Paris, Barcelona and Theme Parks. Some of these trips were residential which always promotes excellent team building, enrichment, as well as raising self-esteem/confidence and always thoroughly enjoyed by students and staff
- Annual Ellenor Hospice Twilight Walk which we hosted here at Saint George's for the first time in September 2024. This will be a developing trend for 2026, and we do hope that many of you, along with friends and family will sign up and come and join us in September 2026. It is an honour to be able to work alongside our local charity, Ellenor Hospice and to fund raise and support them for the invaluable work that they do within the Community. In addition, 2 of our Year 10 students were interviewed by KMFM at the Ellenor Hospice to ask for their input on why they feel the Twilight Walk brings the local Community together
- Years 9, 10, and Year 12's, received an extremely poignant assembly delivered by Martin Cosser, founder of Charlie's Promise, in which he raised awareness of knife crime following the tragic death of his son to knife crime in July 2022. Martin continues to tirelessly raise awareness and has recently been asked to join the Governments Team tackling knife crime within the UK.
- Some of our students have been supported by Blake's Pink Promise counselling services since the beginning of this year and have found their support to be invaluable. In addition, we also utilise Elliot Holmes Memorial Fund EHMF, and Kent Emotional Wellbeing Team, EWT, to support our students mental and emotional wellbeing. 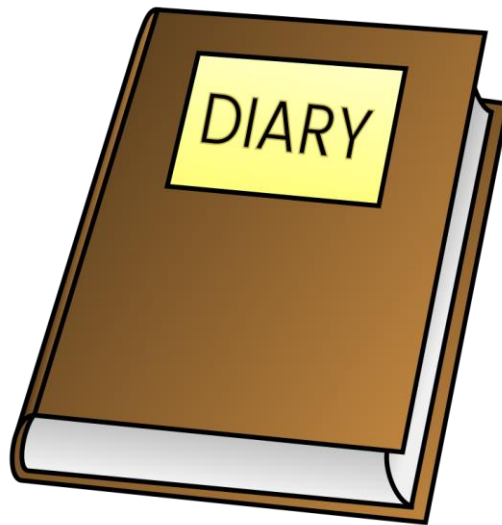
