
<u>Maths - Explore different interpretations and representations of fractions</u>

Describing, comparing and evaluating music using musical vocabulary.

Science-States of Matter

Children will learn about states of matter. They were compared and group materials together, according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases. They will observe that some materials change state when heated or called, and they will identify the parts played by evaporation and condensation in the water cycle.

Computing

This terms unit is the first of the two programming units in Year 4, and looks at repetition and loops within programming. The children will create programs by planning, modifying, and testing commands to create shapes and patterns.

<u>History</u>

In this terms history lessons the children will be learning about another significant civilization, the Vikings. The Vikings, from Scandinavia, were excellent sailors, explorers and warriors. The children will be using their Historical skills to find out their beliefs, where they settled, main events that happened during their timeline and their travel and exploration.



Art and D&T



Our art learning this term surrounds the theme of royalty. We will be looking at the artist Hans Holbein the younger and will be creating posters using chalk or pastels.

Within DT the children will be learning about structures and how some shapes are more rigid than others. They will then use this knowledge to construct their own bridges.

Geography

In our geography learning this time the children will be exploring Europe. They will be using their geography skills to compare and contrast the location of Europe and North America, organise information about common words and phrases in three European languages and graph the population of countries in Europe.
