### Uniform

Thank you for sending your children into school with correct uniform and equipped for the day. Next term lycra short skirts will not be permitted, and we ask that you send your child in on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> February in the correct length skirt. I have included our uniform policy for your reference.

### Equipment

Students are expected to attend school every day with the correct equipment.

- At least two writing pens (Blue or black ink)
- A pencil, ruler, eraser, scientific calculator, a maths set (protractor etc)
- A school bag
- Behaviour for learning card (provided by the school)
- All homework due to be handed in that day
- PE Kit as necessary
- Cooking ingredients as necessary

### **Uniform**

Black trousers or black skirt to knee (no jeans, no skinny trousers) White collared shirt (tucked in) and school tie\* or red and white blouse/shirt Black blazer and school badge\*

Black socks (below the knee) or black or natural tights

Plain coat (no hoodies)

Black Saint George's Jumper\* /cardigan\*/ or plain black v-neck jumper (Optional but not to replace a blazer)

\*Items can be purchased from the school office

### Shoes

All students are expected to wear black leather or leather look shoes

- We do not allow any type of trainers, not even black trainers. Sports shoes are not permitted
- Bots are not permitted unless under trousers
- Heeled shoes are not permitted

















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### Hair, makeup and jewellery

- Natural hair colours only
- No shapes shaved into the hair
- Students are expected to tie long hair back for practical subjects
- One small pair of earrings only
- No facial piercings
- Excessive makeup is not permitted
- Excessively long/fake nails are not allowed due to health and safety in practical lessons

A polite reminder, holidays should not be taken in term time and will not be authorised. Should you choose to take your child on holiday during term time, you may be fined by KCC


















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# Good attendance means...

### Why does attendance matter?

- > You fall behind in work and lessons.
- > You have lower motivation to be here at all.
- Your enjoyment of learning is less.
- You have less chance of achieving GCSEs.
- > You're more likely to show poor behaviour
- You miss out on the social life of school and extra curricular opportunities and experiences.
- It effects your ability to have or keep friendships
