Thank you to all the staff who have run trips this term. The Business Department have taken students to Disneyland Paris and to Warner Bros Studios. Miss Goldberg took the drama students to see 'To Kill a Mockingbird' at the Gielgud theatre. The Languages department took 45 French students to the French institute and arranged for the Onatti Theatre company to come into school and perform a play in Spanish. Tomorrow the PE department are taking over 100 pupils skiing in Canada. I am very grateful for all the time and energy that staff put into organising these opportunities for the pupils.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS, Because.....

- Children with good attendance achieve much better in their learning.
- Absence (Time off) disrupts learning for your child and also for the rest of the class.
- Children who miss school miss out on their right to a full education.
- It is your legal responsibility to ensure that your child attends school regularly.
- Persistent unauthorised absence could lead to court action, including fines.
- For all students below 90% absence evidence is required and should be emailed to the attendance office.
- The attendance office must be informed of all planned absences for medical appointments and student absent due to illness giving full details of absence, this must be before 8.40am for each morning of absence.

96% -100% - 0-7 days - Your child's good attendance will give them every chance of being a successful learner who makes good progress.

92 – 95.9% - 8-15 days - You should try to improve your child's attendance to make sure they have the best possible chance of success in school.

90% - 91.9% - 16-19 days - Your child's attendance is dangerously close to falling to a level which can stop them making progress at school

Below 90% - 20 or more days - Your child is considered a "persistent absentee" in government statistics and their poor attendance is putting them at serious risk of underachieving at school.

Autistic Girls - exploring difference

Thursday 8th June 2023

Time: 9.30 - 2.30pm

Objectives:

- This course will explore how autistic girls and women can present differently to autistic boys.
- It will help parents improve their understanding on how to recognise issues relevant to their autistic girls that may need additional support.
- It will help parents think through ways that they may need to adapt their girl's
 experiences and what they may need to advocate for to help their girls to
 thrive.

Content:

Recent research tells us that there are marked differences in the ways that autism presents in females. The course will explore why autism has been under represented and under diagnosed in female populations and how this is changing. It will also draw on the lived experience of autistic females whose experiences can challenge what we currently think and help us to shape more inclusive spaces for our girls.

Target Audience:

Any parent with a daughter on the autism pathway or with an existing diagnosis. Any interested or concerned wider family/friend/carer who wishes to build their understanding.

The content will mostly be relevant to parents of school age girls.
