
I Am David by Anne Holm


The Secret Garden by Frances Hodgson Burnett


Cloud Busting by Malorie Blackman


Beegu by Alexis Deacon

Beegu is not supposed to be on Earth. She is lost. She is a friendly little creature, but the Earth People don't seem very welcoming at all.


